As part of Helen Bailey's DolphinWatch project, two members of her research team, Jessica Wingfield and Leila Fouda, surveyed the Chesapeake Bay for bottlenose dolphins from the air on April 27. SouthWings pilot Ron Baker flew the survey team over the Patuxent River, down Tangier Sound, and up the Potomac River in search of dolphins in our waterways. Southwings is a charity which connects private pilots with scientists. The weather conditions were ideal! No dolphins were sighted unfortunately, but the team has high hopes of spotting dolphins during their next monthly aerial survey.
