The UMCES Student Voting Plan is the official voting guide that, in compliance with 2021 Maryland House Bill 156 "Student and Military Voter Empowerment Act", outlines the steps that UMCES will take to encourage student civic engagement and voter participation. It also includes information about the 2022 election, including voting procedures for each county or city in which an UMCES unit is located.

The UMCES voter engagement leadership will meet monthly starting in June of the election year. The group will ensure plans, official communications, and any speakers are coordinated at the UMCES and unit levels. The staff and student leaders will meet regularly throughout the year with the University System of Maryland.

Voter Information

Voters in Maryland have three methods to cast their ballots. These include mail-in ballots, early voting, and election day voting. For the 2022 elections, voter registration closes on the following dates:

- Tuesday, June 7, 2022 for the Gubernatorial Primary Election. If using <u>Maryland's Online Voter</u> <u>Registration System (OLVR)</u>, you have until 11:59 pm to submit your application.
- Tuesday, October 18, 2022 for the Gubernatorial General Election. If using <u>Maryland's Online</u> <u>Voter Registration System (OLVR)</u>, you have until 11:59 pm to submit your application.

If you are unable register by the dates above, you still have the option to go to an early voting center in the county where you live during early voting, or go to <u>your assigned election day polling place</u> and bring a document that proves where you live. To prove where you live, bring your MVA-issued license, ID card,

or change of address card, or your paycheck, bank statement, utility bill, or other government document with your name and new address.

Voter Qualifications

To register to vote, you must be:

- A U.S. citizen;
- A Maryland resident; and
- At least 16 years old*.

You cannot have been:

- Convicted of buying or selling votes;
- Under guardianship for mental disability and found by a court to be unable to communicate a desire to vote; or
- Convicted of a felony and currently serving a court-ordered sentence of imprisonment. (Effective March 10, 2016)

*You may register to vote if you are at least 16 years old but cannot vote unless you will be at least 18 years old by the next general election.

Early Voting

Early voting centers are located in each county and available to those eligible to vote. Additionally, voters may drop their ballots off at a number of ballot drop boxes throughout their counties.

Allegany County

The Early Voting Center for Allegany County voters is located at the Allegany County Office Complex / 701 Kelly Road / Room 100 / Cumberland, MD 21502

Calvert County

The Early Voting Center for Calvert County voters is located in the lower level conference room of the Community Resources Building, located at: 30 Duke Street (old library, across from post office) / Conference Room 1 - Lower Level / Prince Frederick, MD 20678.

- **2022 Primary Election: Thursday, June 16, 2022 through Thursday, June 23, 2022** (includes Saturday and Sunday)
- 2022 General Election: Thursday, October 27, 2022 through Thursday, November 3, 2022 (includes Saturday and Sunday)

Dorchester County

The Early Voting Center for Dorchester County voters is located in the Dorchester County Office Building Lobby / 501 Court Lane / Cambridge, MD 21613. Voting Encouragement

UMCES actively encourages students, faculty, and staff to vote via email encouragement from the President's Office. Resources are provided to everyone, including information regarding early voting, mail-in ballots, and in-person voting on election day. UMCES is working toward formalizing an official policy allowing a student to be excused from class or absent from a job with the institution for a period not to exceed 2 hours for the purpose of voting on election day.

Election Judges

June 16-June 23, 2022: Early Voting for the Primary Election

June 28, 2022: Maryland Primary Election

October 27- November 3, 2022: Early Voting for the General Election

Early November 2022: UMCES President to Send out General Election Communication

November 8, 2022: Maryland General Election

November 2022: UMCES Government Liaison to Debrief the UMCES Students on Election Results
